Inventory Points

- 1) How do I set a positive leadership example?
- 2) How effectively are we as a group communicating with each other and with the fellowship as a whole?
- 3) What is our understanding of “authority” and “responsibility” as they relate to group conscience decisions by G.S.R.s, D.C.M.s and our area delegates?
- 4) How do I keep informed about AA as a whole? Do I support, in every way I can, A.A. as a whole, or just the parts I understand and approve of?
- 5) Do I go to enough A.A. meetings or read enough A.A. literature to really keep in touch?
- 6) Do we try to reach important decisions by thorough discussion, vote and, where possible, substantial unanimity?
- 7) Is the “collective conscience” of Alcoholics Anonymous at work in my home group? In my area?
